## The Blessings of This Time and Place



In the months and years after the resurrection, the community of apostles and followers of the risen Christ began to take shape. This was the beginning of the “church,” though it was probably long before anyone was calling it that. We learn in the Acts of the Apostles that the community was characterized by its sense of fellowship and abundance: the earliest Christians “devoted themselves to the apostles’ teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers...day by day, they spent much time together in the temple, they broke bread at home and ate their food with glad and generous hearts” (*Acts 2*). In short, because they had God and they had one another, they had everything that they needed.

We can learn much from those earliest disciples. They were at a very special time in the life of their fledgling movement. They may have been uncertain; they may even have been anxious to get out into the world and make the movement grow. But because they saw value in sharing faith and fellowship together, and because they knew that God was truly present with them then, at *that* time, they were present to the blessings of the moment. They were awake to the blessing of that time, and that place.

Every person mattered, because every person gathered around the table had something to offer of their own journey. Each person mattered, because each person’s story deepened the community’s connection to God. Their abundance was not found in what they had, but in the presence of one another. God was there, in the teachings, the fellowship, and in the breaking of bread.

Sometimes it can be hard to see the blessing of “this time and place” because so much can draw our focus away from God’s presence in the here and now. We remember the past fondly, but sometimes overlook the grace in the present moment, or even the new things that God might be calling us to experience. So, too, do we look forward to what we hope will be a future filled with abundant blessings; but if in so doing we overlook the presence of God in the person sitting right next to us, then we miss out on the blessing of this time, and this place. God’s abundant spirit is with us today, and if we can live our lives awake to that reality, then our eyes will be opened to wonderful things.

I give thanks for the abundant spirit of grace that I find in the community of St. Andrew’s, here at this time, and here in this place. As we remember our past, we have much to celebrate. As we look to our future, we have great reason for hope. But let us always be awake to God’s spirit today, in the presence of each and every person in our sacred community. In so doing we will find that we truly have all that we need.

Hi, my name is Jo and I'll be your Bazaarista.

Walk into a coffee shop and a barista (male or female) will whip up whatever whistle-whetting drink you choose. Walk into a bazaar and a "bazaarista" will serve all your bazaar needs.

In these early days of planning for the event, BJ has affectionately named me the bazaarista. (I guess it's payback for naming him the HRD!) And like a barista in a coffee shop, I get to help whip up a concoction—in this case a bazaar and festival—that is to the liking of my customers.



St. Andrew's Bazaar is the oldest in Greensboro, and it is an event rich with history and tradition. We want to honor this tradition and highlight the vibrancy that is St. Andrew's today.

You may notice that the bazaar is already starting to look a little different. The date has been moved from the first Saturday in November to the 15<sup>th</sup> of October, so we can take advantage of balmy October weather and hold part of our event outside.

We will not be offering as many rooms overall as in the past. Instead, we will focus more attention on each room that is present. A few things have been added, namely a basket room, an art gallery, and we're inviting vendors to offer their crafts.

A few things will be changing, such as the food we offer. Rather than a full-service lunch, we will be offering festival food on the lawn. This will free up the Parish Hall for more booths and many hands to participate in other areas of the bazaar.

Yes, our bazaar is getting a new look. In fact, it even has it's own planning website. To stay up to date on all the crafts, organization and planning going into the bazaar, check out our Google site: <http://sites.google.com/site/standrewsbazaar/>.

But the bazaar cannot be managed by one bazaarista, or even by a small committee of them. It takes a community of bazaaristas to craft this event. It is my hope that everyone in the parish, from the smallest to the tallest, will get involved.

We'll be offering a "Craft of the Month" for folks to take home and prepare. We'll be offering craft workshops not only to create items to sell but also to create community among the participants. We'll be asking the children to decorate a card for each person to take home.

The bazaar is not only a chance to raise money to support our church, it is also a chance to show community what a caring, wonderful church St. Andrew's is. I hope you will be a part of this adventure.

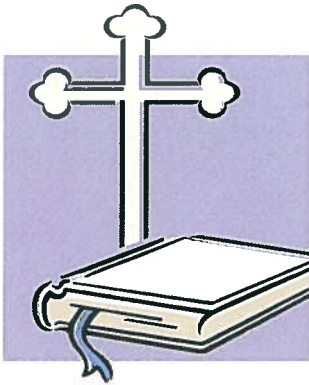

## From Information to Transformation, the path of Christian Maturity!

*If you want to*

- Learn more about the Christian Faith and its biblical roots,
- Find a better way of integrating faith with your daily life,
- Share your concerns and thoughts with fellow seekers,

*Then, Efm can be a pathway to growth!*

Don't let the program's title throw you - as baptized Christians we're all called to some form of ministry in Christ's name. Efm is a worldwide parish-based program designed to help lay people achieve the things listed above, AND better discern their ministries in the world.

The complete program takes four years, but you sign up for a year at a time. Each year there are 34 weekly seminar sessions of 2 ½ hours, with 3-4 hours needed for reading/preparation. Readings follow the STORY OF THE PEOPLE OF GOD, from Hebrew Scripture through contemporary Christianity. The seminars give opportunity to discuss the readings, reflect theologically about Christian faith and life, and share concerns about daily living.

The cost for Efm is \$340 a year (paid by check to Efm or credit card). Scholarships are available for anyone finding difficulty meeting this expense, but willing to commit the time and effort involved. Efm meets on Monday evenings at 6:30 pm at St. Andrew's.

On June 12, 2011, we will be celebrating Efm graduation. Please join us for this special occasion. We will be able to answer all your questions after the service.
